

The impacts of disparity can be a difficult concept for people to fully understand Example: Yale Study from 2017: Americans Misperceive Racial Economic Equality For every \$100 earned by an average white family, how much do you think is earned by an average black family?

For every \$100 in wealth accumulated by an average white family, how much wealth has the average black family accumulated?

- •Americans, on average, systematically overestimate the extent to which society has progressed toward racial economic equality. This is largely driven by overestimates of current racial equality.
- •Results suggest that the tendency to overestimate racial economic equality is likely shaped by both motivational and structural factors (i.e.: societal fairness and network racial diversity) that lead people to deny or remain unaware of the ways race can shape economic outcomes.



•If we want people to have a better understanding of racial inequality the solution isn't simply to report these statistics more widely. It is to get Americans thinking about and recognizing the underlying forces at work (discrimination in hiring practices, lending practices, voting rights, etc.).

Rockland County - Overview


- Smallest county by area, outside of the 5 boroughs of NYC

Trailing behind only Nassau and Westchester


- Due to Lower Hudson Valley location, New York City has a major influence on the social determinants at work here






Economic Disparities in Rockland County

The median household income by Race/Ethnicity in Rockland County between 2012-2014:

\$89,243 for White residents \$74,385 for Black residents \$61,689 for Hispanic residents

Although Hispanic residents of Rockland County make up just 17.1% of the population, 16.0% of Hispanic families live below poverty level compared to 9.5% of White families and 8.5% of Black families






Percentage of Premature Deaths (<75yrs), by Race/Ethnicity, 2012-2014










Percentage of Low Birthweight Births (<2.5kg), by Race/Ethnicity, 2012-2014




Infant Mortality per 1,000 Live Births, by Race/Ethnicity, 2012-2014

Asthma Hospitalizations per 10,000 Population (aged 0-17yrs), by Race/Ethnicity, 2012-2014


Asthma Hospitalizations per 10,000 Population (Age-Adjusted), by Race/Ethnicity, 2012-2014

Diabetes Mortality per 100,000 Population, Age-Adjusted, by Race/Ethnicity, 2012-2014



Female Breast Cancer Mortality per 100,000 Female Population, Age-Adjusted, 2011-2013




Disparity Takes Many Forms

- Approximately 20% of NY's LGBT adults are current smokers compared to the state rate of 15%. Similar patterns were observed for health risk behaviors such as binge or heavy drinking of alcoholic beverages and sugar-sweetened beverage consumption.
- NY's LGBT adults experience higher rates of certain health conditions when compared to NY's overall adult population. While 15% of NY adults have ever been diagnosed with a depressive disorder, the rate for LGBT adults is over 21%. While 17% of NY adults rate their health status as fair or poor, the rate for transgender adults is over 30%.
- Indicators of health care access, no personal doctor or health care provider and no health insurance, are also experienced at higher rates among NY's LGBT adult population in comparison to NY's overall adult population.
