

Child Care Assistance Program

The Child Care Assistance Program helps pay for the cost of day care for income eligible Rockland County residents. These may include families:

- On Temporary Assistance and working or participating in a work activity
- In receipt of Child Protective or Preventive Services
- Who are working a minimum of 10 hours per week and earning less than 85% of the State Median Income
- Families earning less than 85% of the state Median Income and are:
 - A teen parent attending a public or private educational facility providing a standard high school curriculum offered by or approved by the local school district.
 - A teen Parents attending an education program that prepares them to obtain a NYS High School equivalency diploma
 - youth up to the age of 24 currently or previously in foster care who are attending a two-year full-time degree granting program at a community college, a two-year college, or an undergraduate college with a specific vocational goal leading to an associate degree or certificate of completion.
 - youth up to the age of 24 currently or previously in foster care who are attending a training program, which has a specific occupational goal and is conducted by an institution other than a college or university that is licensed or approved by the State Education Department
