Item #1: The meeting was called to order at 6:02 pm.

M. Specht: Good evening everybody. I'll welcome you and call to order this meeting of the Rockland County Sewer District No. 1 for tonight, July 27, 2023. We're going to start with the pledge to the flag. I'm going to ask Commissioner Kenny to lead us in the Pledge. Thank you.

Item #5:

M. Specht: We'll go to the next item. Actually, these items are related, the next several items. I'll ask our Executive Director to discuss them.

M. Saber: This will be for resolutions 5, 6, 7, and 8. The resolutions are for approving the supplemental engineering report and updated SEQRA, amending the Capital Budget, requesting increased bonding for the project and submitting an application to the NYS Comptrollers' Office

for the Sludge Dewatering Project. The centrifuges used for sludge dewatering and most of the auxiliary equipment are beyond economical repair.

During the design phase, it was noted that the original engineering report had sized the centrifuge equipment incorrectly for the projected sludge production. By having to increase the size of the centrifuge equipment, the roof needs to be raised, and additional modifications need to be made to the room configurations, plumbing, and electrical. Since all of this additional work needed to be done, the District chose to change the dewatering equipment to screw presses. The screw presses were originally preferred but not chosen due to roof and room constraints. Since now in either case the roof and rooms need to be modified, the District wishes to proceed with the screw press alternative. Since proposals were requested for this project, the District identified additional struvite deposits in our piping and equipment. Struvite deposits decrease the diameter of our piping and cause valves and pumps not to function. The District requested that EDR provide additional struvite mitigation as part of this project. An HVAC evaluation was also done. Based on current codes, additional HVAC improvements will need to be done.

The project's anticipated costs is \$44,000,000. The increase cost to a typical property owner ranges from \$16.92 to \$29.86.

I would recommend that the Board approve these resolutions.

RESOLUTION NO. 45 OF 2023 DECLARING THE INTENT OF THE RCSD #1 TO ESTABLISH ITSELF LEAD AGENCY FOR THE TWIN AVENUE SEWER UPGRADE PROJECT

WHEREAS, the Rockland County Sewer District No. 1 (hereinafter "RCSD") proposes to increase the capacity of the sewer mains on Twin Avenue and downstream sewer mains on Maple Avenue and Parker Street up to the Ramapo Interceptor in the Village of Spring Valley, and,

WHEREAS, these sewer mains are near capacity and need to be increased in size, and,

WHEREAS, the Twin Avenue Sewer Upgrade Project (hereinafter "Project") is subject to the State Environmental Quality Review Act, 6 NYCRR Part 617 ("SEQRA"), which requires activities like the Project, that are proposed by a unit of local government, like the RCSD, to conduct an environmental impact assessment to identify and mitigate the significant environmental impacts of the proposed Project, and,

WHEREAS, under SEQRA, a lead agency must be designated to conduct the environmental assessment of the proposed Project, and,

WHEREAS, RCSD is the agency that will most closely be involved with the planning, designing and construction of the proposed Project, now, therefore, be it,

RESOLVED, that the Rockland County Board of Sewer Commissioners hereby approves RCSD's intent to declare itself as lead agency for the purpose of conducting an environmental assessment of the proposed Project, and, be it.

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Executive Director is hereby authorized and directed to take any and all necessary or appropriate actions for the RCSD to be lead agency, including, without limitation, the issuance of all necessary notices.

We have been doing this with the help of consultants who draft PLA Feasibility Studies. Arace & Company Consulting, LLC assisted the District with this effort. The PFS for Sludge Thickeners Upgrade Project recommends a PLA with a potential savings of \$163,509. WHEREAS, pursuant to Rockland County Resolution 303 of 1996, in all construction projects in excess of \$250,000.00, the County Executive and the appropriate department head are required to explore and consider using project labor agreements to reduce construction costs, avoid delay claims and potential litigation, when the use of a project labor agreement is rationally based upon reasons in the public interest promoted by the competitive bidding statutes, and,

WHEREAS, the District hired Arace & Company Consulting, LLC (Arace) to conduct a Project Labor Agreement (PLA) Feasibility Study for the Sludge Thickeners Upgrade Project, and,

WHEREAS, Arace submitted its findings to the District in a report dated June 15, 2023 entitled Project Labor Agreement Feasibility Study, and,

WHEREAS, the report indicates that the use of a PLA for the Sludge Thickeners Upgrade Project will result in approximately \$163,509.00 in potential savings for labor costs if a PLA is approved for this project, and,

WHEREAS, Arace recommends that a PLA be incorporated into the Sludge Thickeners Upgrade Project based upon a review of many factors that will result in an estimated cost savings, now, therefore, be it,

RESOLVED, that the Board of Sewer Commissioners, Rockland County Sewer District No. 1, accepts the report prepared by Arace & Company Consulting, LLC, and, be it,

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Sewer Commissioners, Rockland County Sewer District No. 1, authorizes the Executive Director of the District and requests the County Executive of Rockland County to present to the Legislature of Rockland County the findings and recommendations associated with the use of a project labor agreement in connection with the Sludge Thickeners Upgrade Project contained in the report prepared by Arace & Company Consulting, LLC which recommendations will thereafter be subject to ratification by the Legislature of Rockland County, and, be it,

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Sewer Commissioners, Rockland County Sewer District No. 1, authorizes the Executive Director of the District to do and cause to be done any and all acts necessary or proper in connection with or for carrying out this resolution.

Item #14:

M. Saber: This is for a standard work day. Pursuant to Regulation 315.4 of the New York Codes, Rules and Regulations, elected/appointed officials are required to submit a record of work-related activities for three consecutive months beginning on April 1, 2023, as activities which reflect duties performed that are directly related to their elected/appointed position.

RESOLUTION NO. 47 OF 2023

ADOPTING A STANDARD WORKDAY AND REPORTING RESOLUTION FOR ELECTED AND APPOINTED OFFICIALS IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE OFFICE OF THE NEW YORK STATE COMPTROLLER

WHEREAS, Pursuant to Regulation 315.4 of the New York Codes, Rules and Regulations, elected/appointed officials are required to submit a record of work-related activities for three consecutive months beginning on April 1, 2023, as activities which reflect duties performed that are directly related to their elected/appointed position, and,

WHEREAS, some Sewer Commissioners need to comply with the reporting requirements of a Standard Workday, now, therefore, be it,

RESOLVED, that upon the recommendation of the Executive Director, the Board of Sewer Commissioners, Rockland County Sewer District No. 1 approves Adopting a Standard Workday and Reporting Resolution for Elected and Appointed Officials in Compliance with the Requirements of the Office of the State Comptroller, and, be it,

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Executive Director is authorized and directed to execute such documents as may be necessary to carry out the intent of this resolution, after review by the Office of the County Attorney, and, be it,

STILL FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Executive Director is authorized to forward said Agreement to the County Executive for forwarding to the Legislature for their approval.

Item #15: Centrifuges

M. Saber: If you don't mind, I'd like to combine it with the quarterly report.

M. Specht: Sure. Certainly.

<u>Item #16:</u> Quarterly Report

M. Saber: So, currently, the normal expenditures appear to be within reason with a few exceptions but the need to purchase a new centrifuge at an installed cost of \$928,775 is causing some budgetary issues. Now, a little bit on the centrifuge. We have three (3) centrifuges. We're in the process of doing a capital improvement project but I'm struggling to get to the finish line without replacing one (1) at this point in time. A couple of weeks ago we were down to zero (0) centrifuges. We managed through it. We got two (2) back and running. They have a tendency to fail at any given moment. So, we need to get this new one in place so it can get us through to when the capital project is completed which will probably be in about three (3) to four (4) years from now. So, that's for the centrifuge but to make up for some of these budgetary issues, I have deferred a pilot study until next year and I am looking at curtailing some other projects or expensing them next year. In addition, the budget is being evaluated as to where potential savings can be had or where a favorable budget line item exists. I will also be looking to use salary savings and/or requesting the contingency fund of \$100,000 to be accessed later this year to offset some expenses, if needed.

I'll have a better position later in September when some of this stuff kind of smooths out and I'll have only the last quarter left to see where we are.

M. Specht: Thank you, Mr. Saber.

M. Saber: You're welcome.

M. Specht: Any questions about this? Very good.

Item #17: Orangeburg Plant Performance

M. Saber: In your packet is a summary of some of the performance parameters of the wastewater treatment plant in Orangeburg. The CBOD limit of 85% removal was met the last two months

after several months of not meeting the parameter. Unfortunately, we did not meet the CBOD concentration level of 25 mg/L. We are continuing to monitor our progress for July.

M. Specht: Thank you. Very good.

<u>Item #18:</u> We have one item of New Business to discuss in Executive Session. It's an Executive Session that we need because we are going to discuss matters leading to the appointment of a particular person or corporation. So, it will fall under one of the exceptions that allow an Executive Session.

Leave Executive Session at 6:25pm Motion: G. Hoehmann and M. Genito

M. Specht: We are now out of Executive Session. At this time, for the record, we had a discussion about matters leading to the appointment of a particular person or corporation.

At this time, we'll go back up to the Quarterly Report discussion for one (1) additional item.

M. Saber: So, after the budget was approved at the last Board meeting, on July 7th, we received some information on a re-financing that occurred. What happened was we had over borrowed so we were using some of that money partly to pay down the bond this year and partly next year but when they re-financed the bond, they applied everything to the principal this year. So, there's no funds available for next year. There's a net that we'll be short of \$304,000 next year that wasn't in the budget. The way we're going to do this is we're just going to take that additional \$304,000 out of fund balance. Currently we have \$11.5 million which would get reduce to 11.2 million. I just want to let the Board know this was something that occurred after the Board approved the budget. I don't need anything done from the Board right now because in December I'll come back and that's when you set the rates. I just didn't want this to be a surprise that I knew it for six (6) months and didn't say anything.

S. Lehman: We did a refinancing and ended up being a net loss to us?

M. Saber: No. Over the entire borrowing, it's about a \$106,000 saving a year and it winds up in the overall number of over a million dollars.

S. Lehman: Okay.

M. Saber: What happened is the money that we were going to use for next year they used against the principle before they refinanced.

S. Lehman: Okay. I get it.

M. Specht: We appreciate your updating us on that. We'll just mention that we're not going to hold a meeting in August. We'll come back in September.

Motion to Adjourn.
