Item #1: The meeting was called to order at 6:07 pm.

M. Specht: Good evening everybody. I'll call to order this meeting of the Rockland County Sewer District No. 1 for tonight, May 23, 2024. We'll start with the pledge of allegiance. I'm going to ask Commissioner Connell to lead us in the Pledge. Thank you.

RESOLUTION NO. 19 OF 2024 ADOPT MINUTES OF MEETING OF MARCH 26, 2024

WHEREAS, G. Hoehmann offered the following resolution, which was seconded by S. Lehman and approved unanimously, now, therefore, be it,

RESOLVED, that the transcribed amended Minutes of the Rockland County Sewer District No. 1 Meeting of March 26, 2024, as recorded by the Clerk, are hereby adopted.

<u>Item #5:</u>

M. Specht: I'll ask our Executive Director to discuss that.

M. Saber: While performing the work for the Main Pump Station Upgrade project for the wastewater treatment plant in Orangeburg, additional valves, gates, breakers, wiring, and materials of construction were identified as needing to be upgraded. These upgrades were not identified during the design phase and were not part of the original scope of the project. The costs for these improvements are \$505,387.43. I would recommend increasing the contract by \$600,000 in case any other unforeseen improvements are required. The current contract is in the amount of \$15,585,000. With the recommended improvements, the total contract amount would be \$16,185,000.

M. Specht: Thank you. Any questions for Mr. Saber?

M. Saber: There's one more item. In addition, I would recommend a contract extension from March 13, 2024 to June 27, 2024. This 106 day no cost time extension is related to supply chain issues and delays with receiving equipment. It's a two (2) part change order.

M. Specht: Very good. Do we need a separate motion for the second part?

M. Saber: No, it was all in the same change order.

RESOLUTION NO. 20 OF 2024 APPROVAL OF CHANGE ORDER NO. 1 MAIN PUMP STATION UPGRADE PROJECT, CONTRACT RFB-RC-SWR-CIP-2020-02

WHEREAS, Change Order No. 1, Contract RFB-RC-SWR-CIP-2020-02 with Tomar Construction NY LLC, Main Pump Station Upgrade Project, has been proposed, and,

WHEREAS, this contract is to replace and install six (6) new influent pumps, motors, pump station suction & discharge piping, valves, and appurtenances; replacement and extend pump discharge pipe header, surge relief valves and associated piping; replacement and installation of two (2) new screen channel slide gates and one (1) wetwell slide gate; replacement and installation of a new instrumentation and control system, motor control centers and complete other miscellaneous electrical work; replacement and installation of new ventilation system and provide a new air conditioning system, interior stair, plumbing and miscellaneous architectural and structural modifications, provide bypass pumping and temporary services, and,

WHEREAS, the Summary of Change to Contract involves an increase to the contract in the amount of \$600,000 due to additional upgrades, such as additional valves, gates, breakers, wiring, and materials of construction not identified during the design phase and not included in the original scope of project, and,

WHEREAS, the increase also includes any other unforeseen improvements needed and a 106 day no cost time extension extending the terms to June 27, 2024, and,

WHEREAS, this time extension is related to supply chain issues and delays with receiving equipment, and,

WHEREAS, Change Order No. 1 increases the total contract amount to \$16,185,000, and,

WHEREAS, the staff of the Sewer District has participated in discussions concerning Change Order No. 1 and has reviewed the details and found them acceptable, now, therefore, be it,

RESOLVED, that upon the recommendation of the Executive Director, the Board of Commissioners, Rockland County Sewer District No. 1, does hereby approve Change Order No. 1, Contract RFB-RC-SWR-CIP-2020-02 in the amount of \$600,000 for a total contract amount of \$16,185,000 and a 106 day no cost time extension extending the terms to June 27, 2024, and, be it,

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Sewer Commissioners hereby authorizes and directs the Executive Director to execute Change Order No. 1 and any other documents as may be required to carry out the intent of this resolution following review by the Office of the County Attorney, and, be it,

STILL FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Executive Director is authorized to forward said documents to the County Executive for forwarding to the Legislature for their approval.

Item #6:

M. Saber: The Sewer District has been providing services to the Village of Spring Valley since the early 2000s. The intent at that time was to enter into an intermunicipal agreement to memorialize the services. The IMA process was never completed. The Sewer District has been charging residents of the Village for these services through an additional user charge. At this point, it is advantageous to finalize an agreement.

I recommend that the IMA that's attached to the resolution be approved subject to final review by the Village and the County's Department of Law.

RESOLUTION NO. 21 OF 2024 AUTHORIZE INTERMUNICIPAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN ROCKLAND SEWER DISTRICT NO. 1 AND THE VILLAGE OF SPRING VALLEY FOR THE OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE OF SEWER LINES

WHEREAS, the Village of Spring Valley (Village) is the owner of the portion of sewer lines located within the Towns of Ramapo and Clarkstown, and,

WHEREAS, it is the mutual desire of Rockland County Sewer District No. 1 (District) and the Village for the District to operate and maintain the sewer lines, and,

WHEREAS, the District and the Village intend to enter into this intermunicipal agreement for the operations and maintenance, and,

WHEREAS, staff of the District have participated in negotiating the details of the Intermunicipal Agreement and find it acceptable, now, therefore, be it,

RESOLVED, that upon the recommendation of the Executive Director, the Board of Sewer Commissioners hereby authorize the Executive Director to approve the Intermunicipal Agreement with the Village of Spring Valley to operate and maintain the sewer lines subject to all terms and conditions of the Agreement, and, be it,

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Executive Director is authorized and directed to execute such documents as may be necessary to carry out the intent of this resolution, after review by the staff of the Sewer District and the Office of the County Attorney, and, be it,

STILL FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Executive Director is authorized to forward said documents to the County Executive for forwarding to the Legislature for their approval.

Item #7:

M. Saber: The NYSDEC changed the effluent limits for the SPDES permit that was originally analyzed. Therefore, additional engineering services are required and EDR was requested to submit an additional proposal which is included with the resolution. EDR will be utilizing the expertise of Hazen and Sawyer and HDR who are international renowned firms.

EDR's current contract is in the amount of \$405,500. EDR's proposal is in the amount of \$809,200. The work is directly related to the effluent limits of the wastewater treatment plant in Orangeburg. This work is to be completed over three (3) calendar years.

The District has reviewed the proposal and found the same to be within the scope of services needed.

Therefore, I recommend that the Board consider amending the contract with EDR in the amount of \$809,200 for a total contract amount of \$1,214,700.

RESOLUTION NO. 22 OF 2024

AMENDMENT TO CONTRACT WITH ENVIRONMENTAL DESIGN & RESEARCH, LANDSCAPE ARCHITECTURE, ENGINEERING & ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES, D.P.C. (EDR) FOR ENGINEERING SERVICES FOR ADMINISTRATIVE APPEAL AND CHALLENGE OF EFFLUENT LIMITS

WHEREAS, the Sewer District entered into an agreement for \$99,800.00 dated May 14, 2021 with Environmental Design & Research, Landscape Architecture, Engineering & Environmental Services, D.P.C., FOR Engineering Services for Administrative Appeal and Challenge of Effluent Limits, and,

WHEREAS, the agreement was subsequently amended by Board of Commissioners Resolution No. 56 of 2021 for \$305,700 for a total contract amount of \$405,500, and,

WHEREAS, the District was in negotiations with New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC) with regards to the proposed modifications of the District's SPDES permit, and,

WHEREAS, the NYSDEC and the District were not able to come to terms on the final SPDES permit, and,

WHEREAS, the NYSDEC issued a SPDES permit to the District that went into effect on March 1, 2021, and,

WHEREAS, the District objected to the SPDES permit which the NYSDEC then rescinded during the administrative appeal process, and,

WHEREAS, EDR is providing engineering services for the administrative appeal and challenge of effluent permit limits placed in the SPDES permit since they have been assisting the District with the negotiations with the NYSDEC, and,

WHEREAS, the NYSDEC issued a final SPDES permit with an effective date of July 1, 2023, and,

WHEREAS, additional engineering services are now needed for this matter, and,

WHEREAS, these additional services will include: a detailed evaluation of the existing unit processes and equipment at the Orangeburg plant and their future performance capability and reports that are needed for the new SPDES permit and SEQRA process, and,

WHEREAS, EDR will be utilizing the expertise of the engineering firms of Hazen and Sawyer and HDR to help with the additional engineering services required, and,

WHEREAS, in a letter dated May 14, 2024, EDR has submitted a cost proposal in the amount of \$809,200 for a total contract amount of \$1,214,700, and,

WHEREAS, the staff of the Sewer District have reviewed the proposal and found same to be within the scope of services needed, now, therefore, be it,

RESOLVED, that the Board of Commissioners, Rockland County Sewer District No. 1, upon the recommendation of the Executive Director does hereby accept the cost proposal from Environmental Design & Research, Landscape Architecture, Engineering & Environmental Services, D.P.C., for Engineering Services for Administrative Appeal and Challenge of Effluent Limits, in the amount of \$809,200 for a total contract amount not to exceed \$1,214,700, and, be it,

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Executive Director is authorized and directed to execute such documents as may be necessary to carry out the intent of this resolution after review by the staff of the Sewer District and the Office of the County Attorney, and, be it,

STILL FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Executive Director is authorized to forward said documents to the County Executive for forwarding to the Legislature for their approval.

WHEREAS, the Executive Director will attend seminars offering continuing education credits necessary for maintaining his professional engineering license, and,

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the County of Rockland and the Rockland County Sewer District No. 1 for the Executive Director to attend this conference, now, therefore, be it,

RESOLVED that the Board of Commissioners, Rockland County Sewer District No. 1, does hereby authorize the attendance of the Executive Director of the Sewer District at the aforementioned Conference at the expense of the District at a cost not to exceed \$4,250.00.

Item #10: Orangeburg Plant Performance

M. Saber: The CBOD limit of 85% removal has not been met over the last few months. We've actually missed it four (4) out of the last five (5) months. The influent concentration is very weak due to the amount of rain we have been having. We will continue to have this issue until the groundwater table recedes which it has finally started to recede and the flows are finally starting to come down.

Item #11: Budget Committee Selection

M. Specht: First of all, we are looking to see who would like to be on the Budget committee. We have a tentative meeting date of June 11th at 10:00 am if that's agreeable with all the people that wish to attend it. Any volunteers?

M. Specht: Commissioner Hoehmann.

- S. Lehman: Normally, I love to volunteer. I do think I have a conflict at that one specific hour. If we're going to continue with that time, I'll have to pass.
- M. Specht: Okay. Commissioner Genito and myself. How many do we need?
- G. Hoehmann: That's three (3) of us.
- M. Saber: You can't have a quorum.
- M. Specht: We can't have a quorum. Exactly.
- J. Langan: Commission Diaz can attend by conference call.
- M. Specht: That's right. Commissioner Diaz indicated that he would be able to join by phone. Very good. We have a committee. We'll meet on June 11th at 10:00 am. Thank you.

WHEREAS, the staff of the District have reviewed the proposal and found same to be acceptable, now, therefore, be it,

RESOLVED, that the Board of Commissioners, upon recommendation of the Executive Director, does hereby accept the proposal from Joel Dichter, Esq., of Dichter Law LLC for legal services for the Municipal Coalition for Orange and Rockland Electric and Gas Rate Case in the amount of \$15,000.00, and, be it,
