
STATEMENT OF PARTY POSITIONS TO BE FILLED BY THE CONSERVATIVE PARTY AND THE NUMBER OF PERSONS TO BE ELECTED TO EACH SUCH PARTY POSITION AT THE OFFICIAL PRIMARY ELECTION TO BE HELD ON THE 25th DAY OF JUNE, 2024.

TO THE STATE BOARD OF ELECTIONS AND THE BOARD OF ELECTIONS IN EACH COUNTY:

I, Gerard Kassar, Chairman of the State Committee of the New York State Conservative Party, pursuant to the authority vested in the aforesaid office and in accordance with the provisions of the Election Law, the Rules and Regulations of the Conservative Party, and the rules and procedures of the New York State Board of Elections, do hereby

CERTIFY and deliver to and file with the State Board of Elections and the Board of Elections in each County, this statement of party positions to be filled by the Conservative Party, and the number of persons to be elected to each of such party positions, for and to which qualified and enrolled voters of the Conservative Party are to be elected at the official primary elections to be held in the aforesaid State on the 25th day of June, 2024.

- 1. The party positions for which qualified and enrolled voters of the Conservative Party are to be designated in accordance with the provisions of the Election Law, and to which they are to be elected at the official primary election to be held in the aforesaid State on the 25th day of June, 2024.
 - a) Members of the County Committee for any such counties in the aforesaid state which do not have duly elected county committees pursuant to the Election Law and/or which are duly electing county committees pursuant to the Election Law.
 - b) Delegates to the Judicial District Conventions of the Conservative Party.
 - c) Alternate Delegates to the aforesaid Judicial District Conventions of the Conservative Party.
 - d) District Leaders and Associate District Leaders in each Assembly District in each county in the city of New York and in Nassau County (as rules provide) in the same year as the county committee is elected.
 - e) District Leader and Associate District Leader in any district where there is vacancy in a year between years when a county committee is regularly elected.
 - f) Members of the State Committee of the Conservative Party, twelve (12) per Congressional District.
- 2. Under and pursuant to the provision of the Election Law, and pursuant to and in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Conservative Party, in any county which does not have a duly elected county committee pursuant to the Election Law, a county committee shall be elected in 2024 as follows:

Two members from each election district within the county, except as follows. If 150 or more, but not more than 299 Conservative Party votes were cast for governor in any election district in the last preceding gubernatorial election, then three county committee members shall be elected from that election district. If 300 or more Conservative Party votes were cast for governor in any election district in the last preceding gubernatorial election then four county committee members shall be elected from that election district. If the boundaries of any election district have been changed or a new election district has been created since the last preceding gubernatorial election, then three county committee members shall be elected from any such election district if there has been an assembly election in that election district since the last preceding gubernatorial election and 150 or more but not more than 299 Conservative Party votes were cast for member of the assembly therein, or if no such assembly election was held and the Conservative party enrollment in that election district is 150 or more but not more than 299. If the boundaries of any election district have been changed or a new election district has been created since the last preceding gubernatorial election, then four county committee members shall be elected from any such election district if there has been an assembly election in that election district since the last preceding gubernatorial election and more than 300 Conservative Party votes were cast for member of assembly therein, or if no such assembly election was held and the Conservative Party enrollment in that election district is more than 300. Any duly constituted county committee may adopt rules inconsistent with the provision of this section, which rules shall thereupon supersede the provision of this section with regard to such duly constituted county committee.

3. Under and pursuant to the provisions of Section 6-124 of the Election Law and pursuant to and in accordance with Article VIII of the Rules and Regulations of the Conservative Party, the aforesaid Judicial District Conventions shall be constituted by the election from each assembly district of delegates and alternate delegates as follows:

One delegate and one alternate delegate from each assembly district in the 1st, 2nd, 9th, 10th, 11th and 13th Judicial District for each one thousand (1000) votes or major fraction thereof cast in such assembly district for the Party candidate for governor under the Party emblem in the last preceding gubernatorial election.

One delegate and one alternate delegate from each assembly district in the 12th Judicial District for each five hundred (500) votes or major fraction thereof cast in such assembly district the party candidate for governor under the Party emblem in the last preceding gubernatorial election.

One delegate and one alternate delegate from each assembly district in the 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th, 7th and 8th Judicial Districts for each two thousand (2000) votes or major fraction thereof cast in such assembly district for the Party candidate for governor under the Party emblem in the last preceding gubernatorial election.

In no event, however, shall any assembly district be entitled to less than one delegate and one alternate delegate. If, by any reason of a change in the boundaries of assembly districts be after an election of governor, the exact vote at such election in the territory constituting an altered district is not ascertainable, such vote for the purposes of this section shall be estimated.
