The Rockland County Mosquito Control Program is currently working to control the local mosquito population to prevent the spread of West Nile virus and other mosquito-borne diseases.

Mosquitoes use areas of standing water to lay their eggs and the eggs develop into adults. You can help control the population of mosquitoes and reduce the risk of exposure to mosquito-borne diseases by ensuring there are no areas of standing water near your home or where you work. Mosquitoes tend to "breed" in common water-holding objects such as buckets, birdbaths, flowerpots, and unrimmed tires.

Old and/or unused tires cannot be allowed to sit outdoors and collect water. If you are looking to get rid of junk tires, they must be disposed of properly. The following contact list will help you get more information on how to dispose of tires safely and legally:
